- Rapid adoption of new methods of working with supporting toolsets



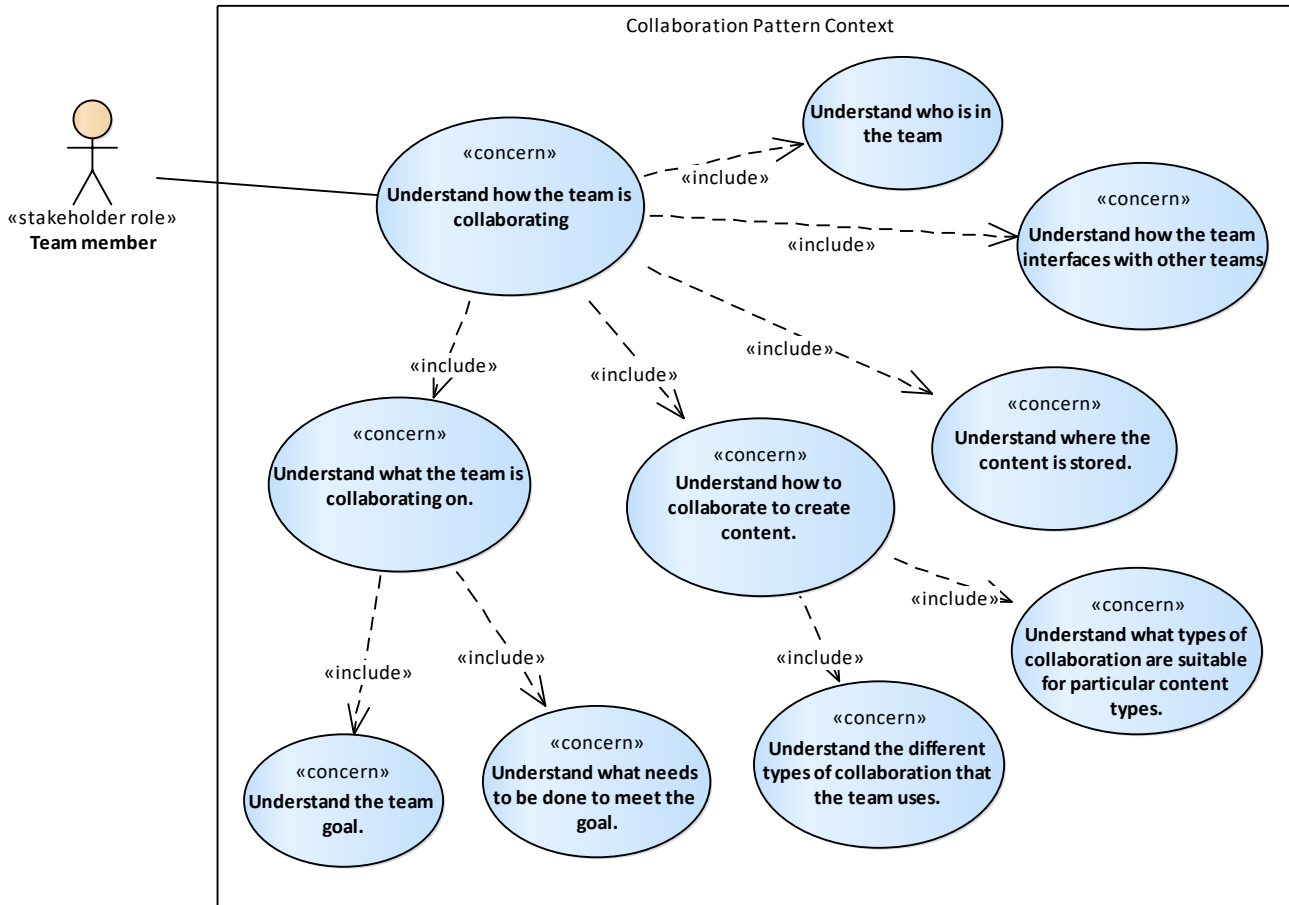
- More communication methods than ever before



- More places where information can be stored



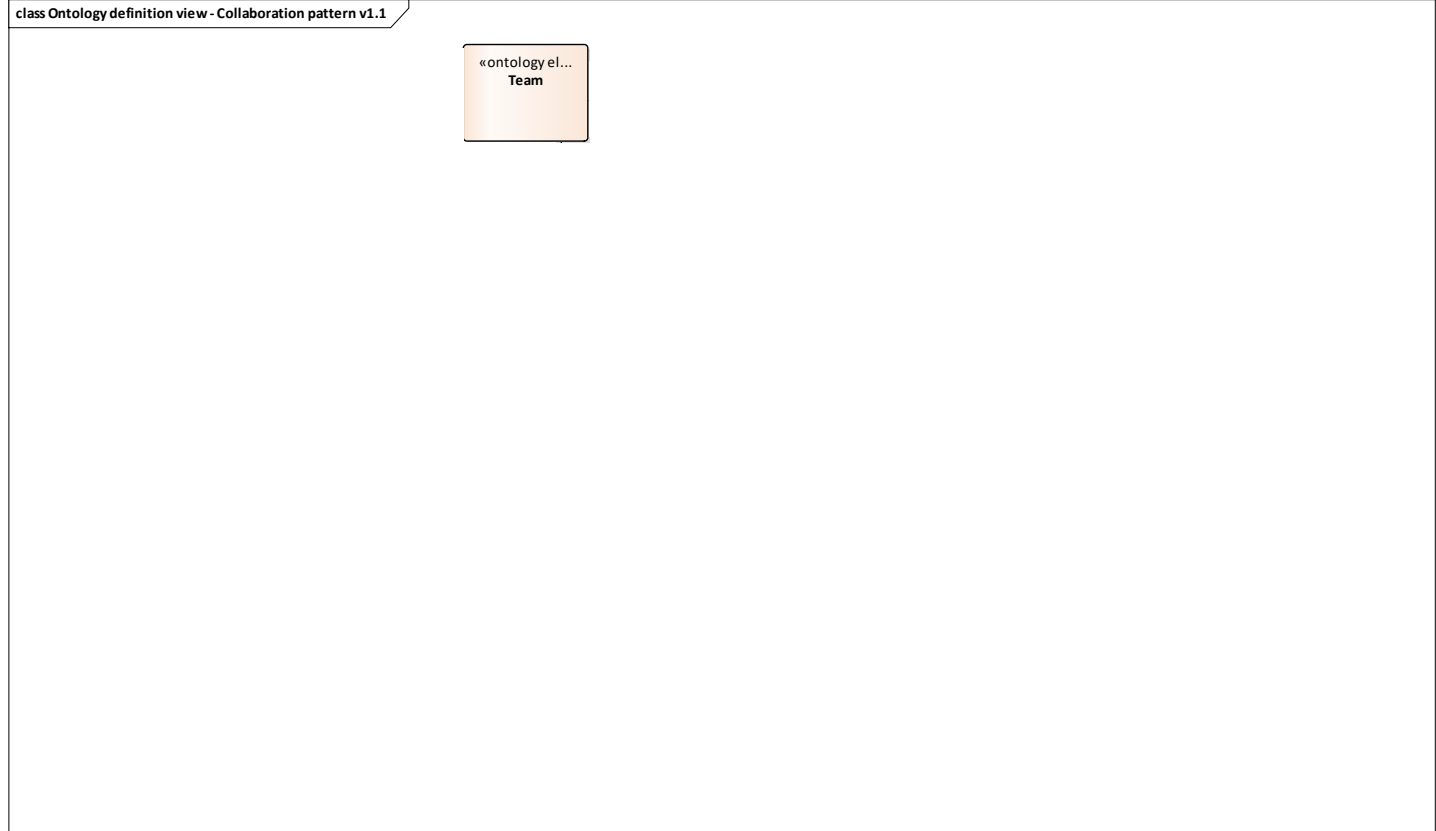

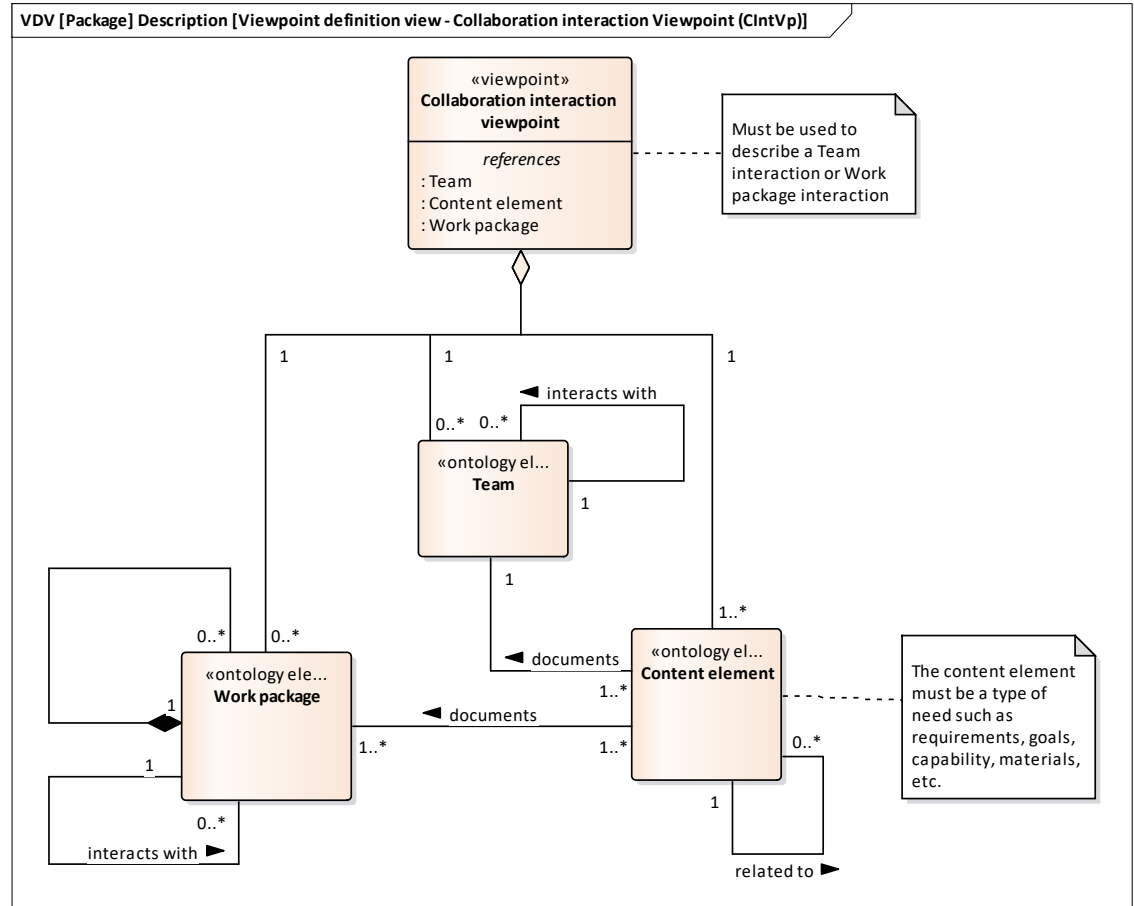
# Collaboration purpose

# Collaboration interaction

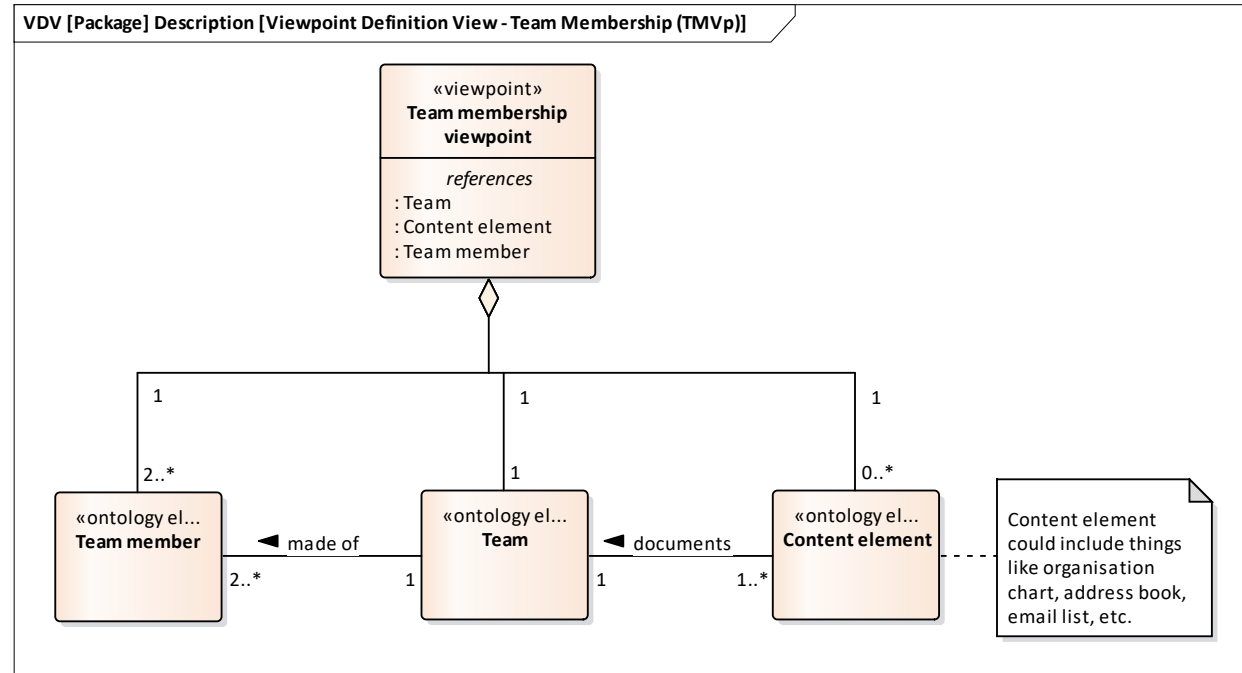
- Interaction between teams

  - Materials





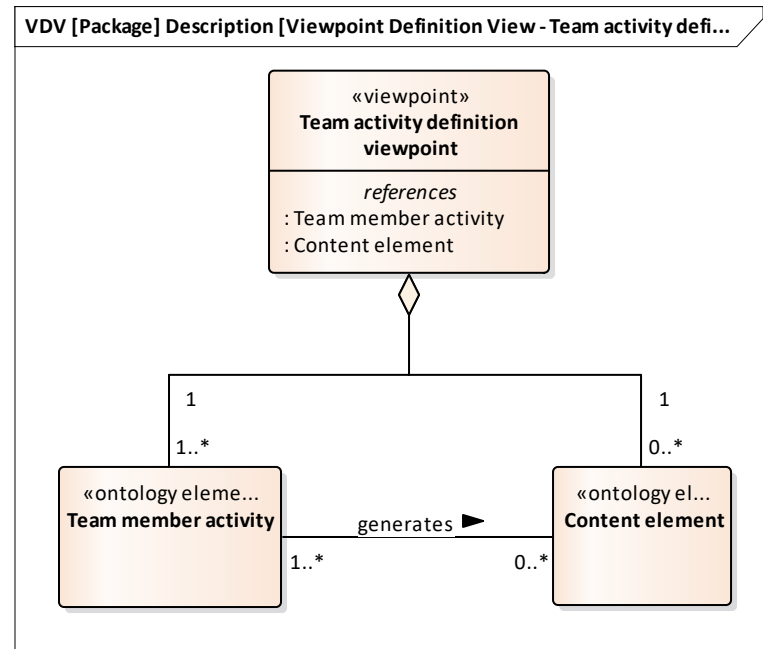
# Team membership

  - Contact lists



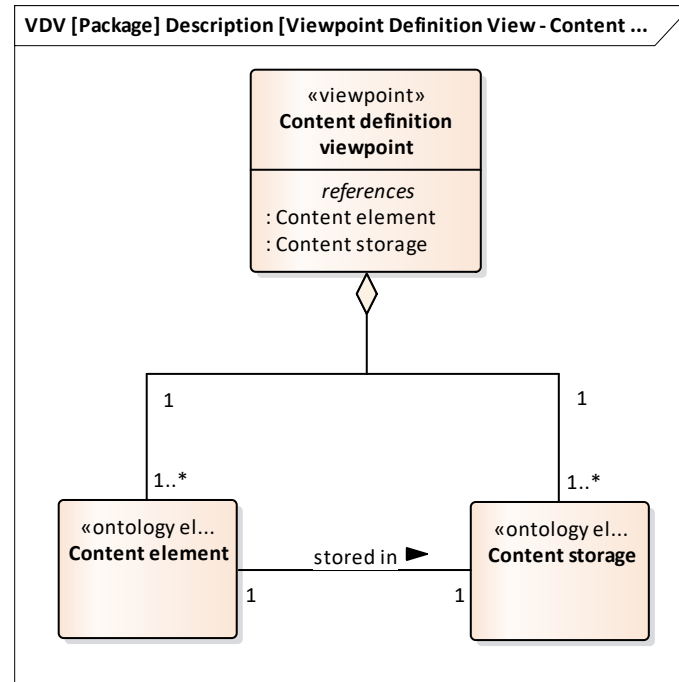
# Team activity definition

- What kind of activity does the team do?
  - Meetings
  - Discussions
  - Workshops
- Could be structured as:
  - Formal collaboration
  - Informal collaboration
  - Individual
- What type of content can be created by each activity
  - Meeting minutes
  - Notes
  - User journeys



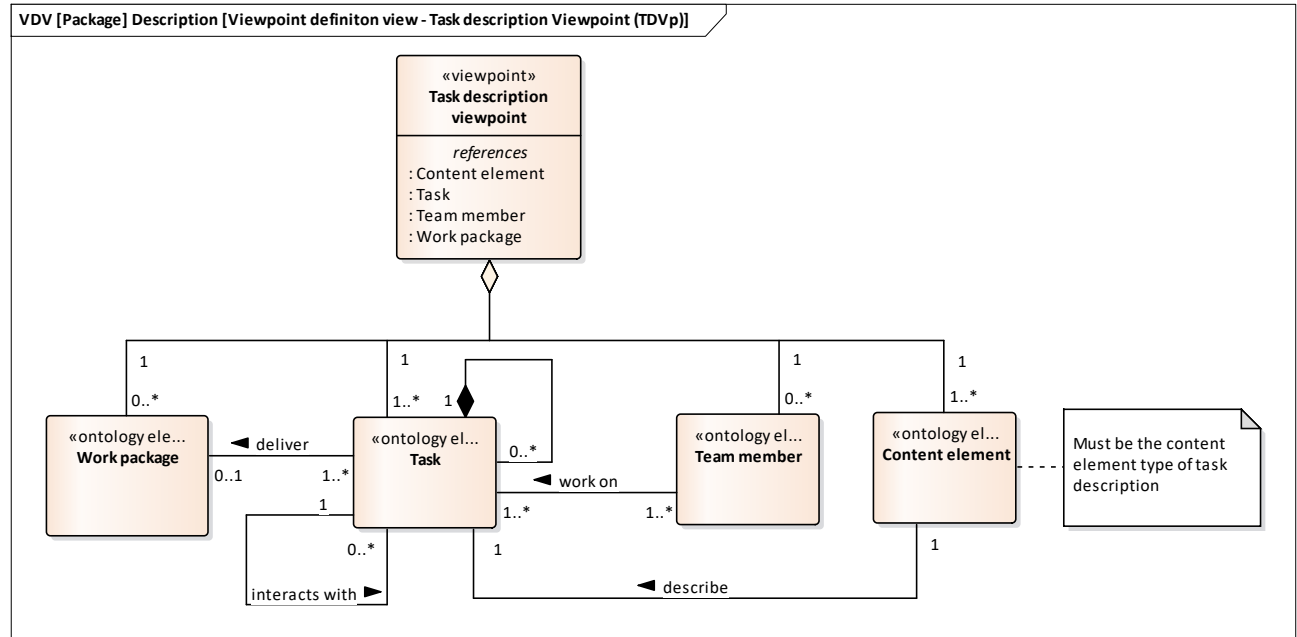
# Content definition

- What are the different types of content.
  - Decisions
  - Requirements
  - Discussions
  - Ideas
  - Questions
  - Research
  - Songs
- Where is the content stored
  - Database
  - OneNote
  - Model
  - Cupboard



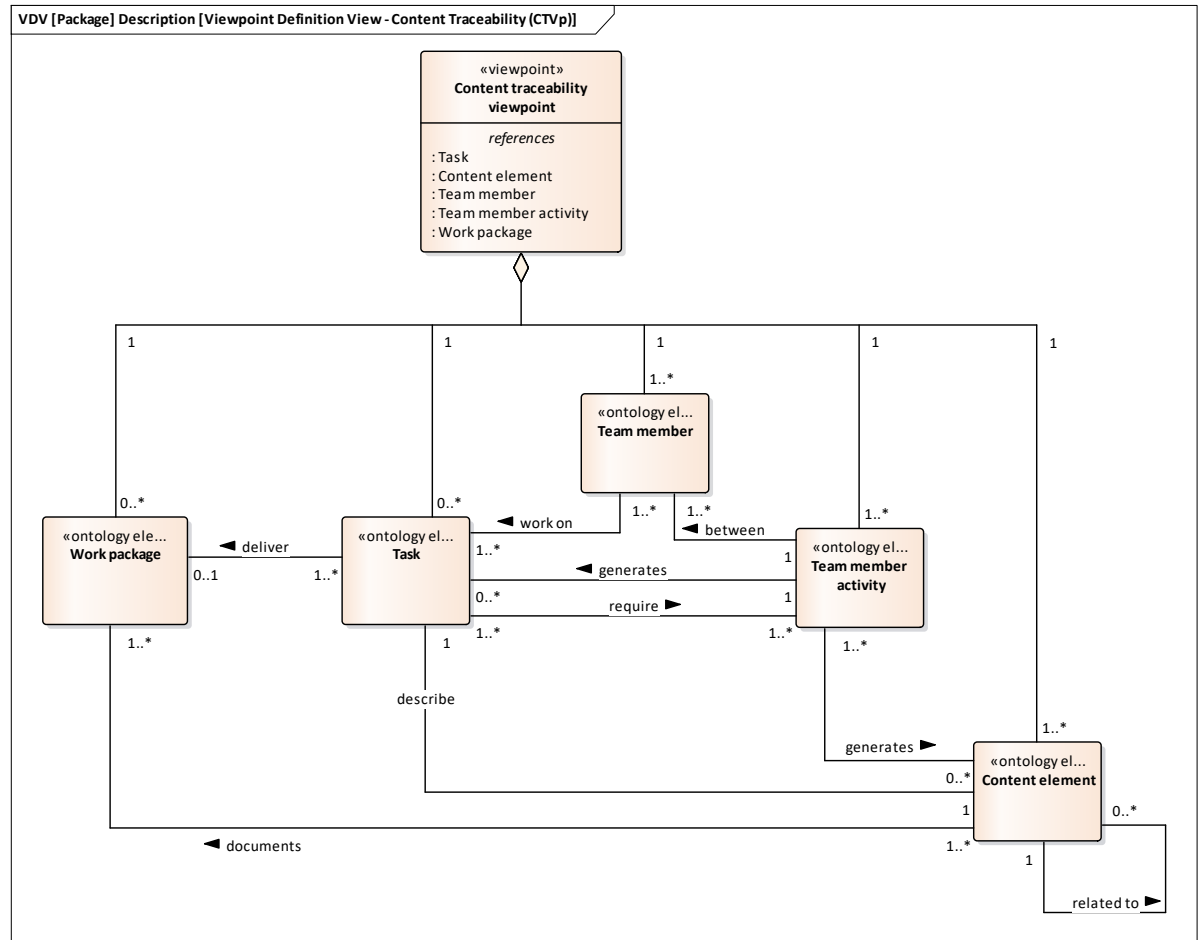
# Task description viewpoint

- What are the tasks?
- Who is working on them?
- How are they structured?
- What are their dependencies?
- Which work packages do they deliver?
- Basically Trello, MS Planner, etc.



# Content traceability

- What was done?
- How was it done?
- Who did it?
- Why did we do it?
